Downtown Wilson Construction Tentatively Scheduled to Begin Monday, July 6

Wilson, Wyoming – Construction for the Downtown Wilson project is tentatively scheduled to begin Monday, July 6, 2026. The project is part of the Teton BUILD Grant effort to improve transportation, safety, and connectivity in the Wilson area.

Community members, commuters, businesses, and visitors should expect construction activity in and around Downtown Wilson once work begins. Additional information about traffic impacts, access, detours, and project phasing will be shared as the construction schedule is finalized.

Because construction timelines are subject to weather, contractor scheduling, and field conditions, the July 6 start date remains tentative.

The Teton BUILD Grant project represents an important investment in local infrastructure and long-term mobility for residents and visitors. The public is encouraged to stay informed and plan ahead for potential construction delays.
